



Instructions

Due to the different forms of Micro-credentials, recognition procedures can vary by country and institutions making Micro-credentials recognition challenging to summarize. There are ongoing efforts to streamline and harmonize recognition procedures across Europe. Within the MicrocredX network we would like to increase the attractiveness and exchange of micro-credentials not only among project partners, but also boost and smooth the way of recognising micro-credentials among countries and different micro-credential providers. Efforts and joint work produced an Implementation framework, which consists of 7 Domains, one of them being Recognition. Please see the additional/attached document.
